Taking time to know your facility's emergency response plan will save time, protect health, safety and the environment.

Understanding your role in an emergency is vital to successfully manage an incident. It is important to have an emergency response plan to outline roles and responsibilities relating to emergency response.

The goal of the emergency response plan is to:

- ensure the safety of workers, responders & the public
- reduce the magnitude of environmental impacts
- reduce the potential for damage to property and product
- assist emergency responders
- reduce recovery time
- inspire confidence in staff, industry and the public

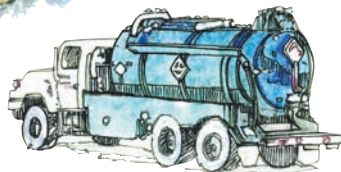
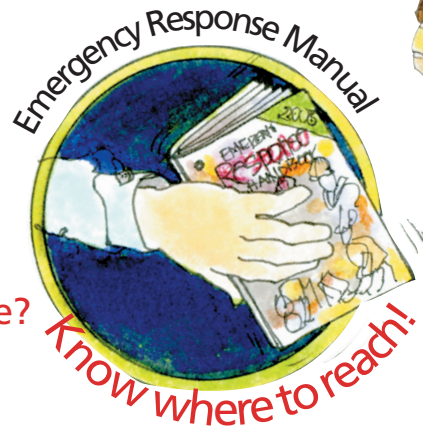
